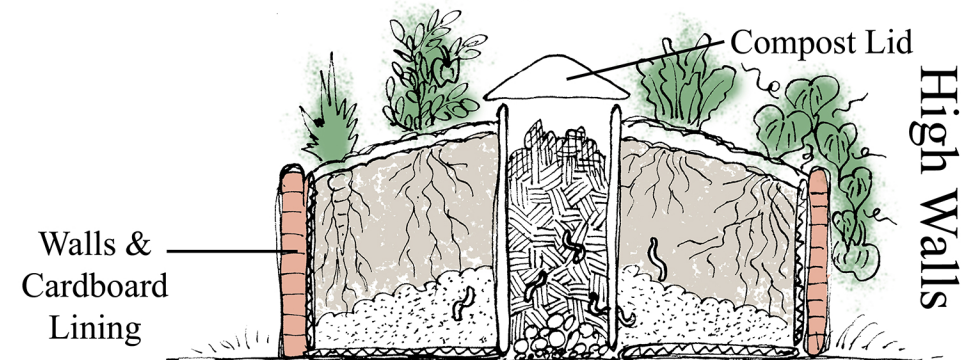
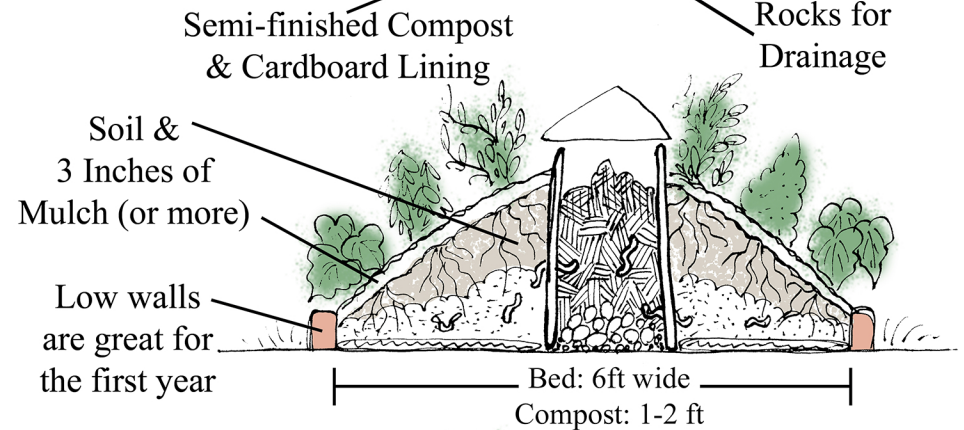
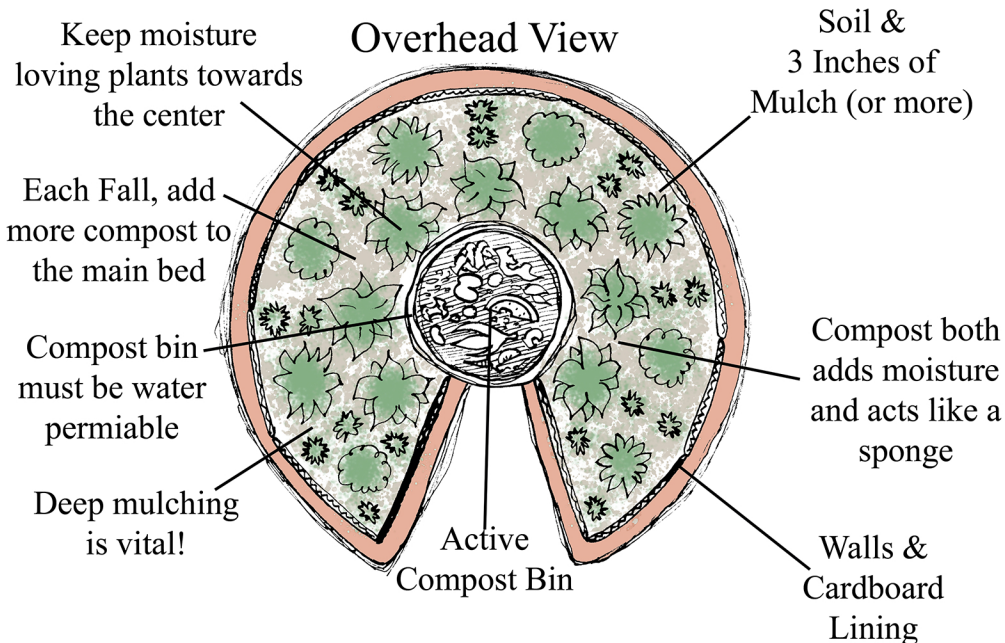
What is Keyhole Gardening?

Designed to minimize water usage, keyhole gardening uses active compost, deep mulching, and a raised bed design to beat the heat.

Made popular in several arid African countries by the organization Send a Cow, Keyhole Gardening uses permaculture techniques to minimize labor and water use while maximizing yield.

It's designed for home vegetable gardens, and you can use the main principles (central active compost bin and deep mulching) in your existing garden, or build your own keyhole bed.

The thick base layer of semi-finished compost on top of cardboard, newspaper, or even phonebooks means no tilling or sodding. Just start building your garden from the ground up!
